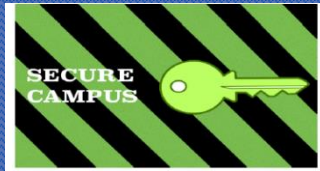
Countywide targeted approach to

IMMEDIATE ACTION RESPONSE: THE BIG FIVE

Safety Recap: November 8 Lockdown/Barricade



- 11/8 PGPD initiated lockdown/barricade immediate action response protocol at PGHS, FG and all schools at David Ave due to an immediate threat reported at the David Ave Campus.
- Those sites, in addition to others in the district, implemented emergency protocols until lifted by PGPD.
- All schools followed their safe school protocols in a swift and effective manner.
- Communication to students, staff, and community was made within minutes of the lockdown.
- Site to site communication occurred through the use of district radios.
- When the lockdown was lifted by law enforcement, families were notified and sites resumed to their regular schedules.

Safety Communication

- **Remind Notification System**: Site principals will continue to use the Remind Notification System to communicate with students and families about school activities and events.
- **School Messenger**: Immediate Action Emergency Response notification to community will come from the district.
